Eleventh Coast Guard District Auxiliary, Southern Region Policy Directive O6-04

Subj: PERSONNEL SECURITY PROGRAM, CHANGES TO SUITABILITY  
DETERMINATIONS

Ref: (a) COMDTINST M16790.1F, Auxiliary Manual  
(b) ALCOAST 231/06, Change to Auxiliary Personnel Security Investigation policy

1. PURPOSE. This directive incorporates changes in the PSI program into the requirements and timelines for members of the Eleventh Coast Guard District (SR) Auxiliary.
2. DIRECTIVES AFFECTED. Eleventh Coast Guard District Auxiliary, Southern Region Policy Directive 06-02 is hereby cancelled.
3. ACTION. Director of Auxiliary (DIRAUX), Sector, and Unit Commanders, Auxiliary elected and appointed officers shall ensure all Auxiliary personnel become familiar with and adhere to the provisions of this Directive. DIRAUX shall provide oversight and support as required.
4. BACKGROUND. Prior to release of reference (b), all auxiliary members participating in the following programs were required to obtain a Favorable Direct Operational (DO) status from the CG Security Center (SECCEN):

Surface operations (i.e. Boat Crew program)  
Air operations Air Crew program  
Operations planning  
Interpreters  
CMDCCN/OPCCN/COMMS watch standing  
Fixed/mobile radio facility operators  
Fingerprint Examiners  
Port Security  
Marine Safety & Security  
Some Staff officers  
CGAUX Health Care Volunteers

Of those from the above list, only Air Auxiliary members, Fingerprint Examiners and Auxiliary Elected officers (as defined by Appendix D of the Auxiliary Manual) are still required to obtain DO Status. Effective immediately, the remainder of the specialties listed revert automatically back to OS status unless the operational commander (or in the case of staff officers the DIRAUX or CHDIRAUX can set the requirement) deem the need for any Auxiliarist to obtain DO status. An example would be selected OPCEN watchstanders that require access to and handling of classified material.

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5. DISCUSSION. As the three-year process for completing security investigations for all Auxiliarists winds down, D11sr still has a significant number of members who have not submitted PSI packages. Reluctance to submit to the level of scrutiny a DO screening entails may be contributing to the slow submission rate. By fully instituting the provisions of reference (b) in D11sr, the submission rate is expected to go up.

- a Every Current Member must have a PSI package (for either DO or OS) submitted to SECCEN, as processed by Judith Hall, DIRAUX staff PSI Coordinator, no later than 30 September 2006. Therefore, all members must submit their completed packages to Ms. Hall not later than 15 September 2006 to assure timely submission to SECCEN. If a member's package has not been submitted to SECCEN by 30 September 2006 through the member's failure to submit a complete and accurate package timely enough to meet the internal review requirements, that member will be disenrolled from the Auxiliary; no exceptions. Likewise, no 2007 dues will be accepted if security paper work has not been submitted timely for processing by Ms. Hall.
- b Auxiliarists who have already received favorable DO PSI determination will still have such status reflected in the security section of AUXDATA regardless of whether or not they meet the revised DO PSI criteria. Auxiliarists who have already been given an Unfavorable DO determination but Favorable OS and who were removed from the Boat Crew program will be reinstated.



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
